1. Ofsted Framework. September 2019

- Consultation closed 5th April
- New framework launched today (14th May)
- 'The new framework puts the real substance of education at the heart of inspection and supports leaders and teachers who act with integrity.'



Ofsted Framework. September 2019

'Ofsted inspectors will spend less time looking at exam results and test data, and more time considering how a nursery, school, college or other education provider has achieved their results. That is, whether they are the outcome of a broad, rich curriculum and real learning, or of teaching to the test and exam cramming."

Consultation outcomes:

- Four new judgements (3 new 1 very similar)
- Good schools will normally receive a two-day section 8 inspection approximately every four years.
- No on-site preparation; instead enhanced prep
- Off-rolling will be a focus
- Revised guidance on inspecting

- Branded as 'Teacher Vacancies'
- Response to high and ever-increasing recruitment costs for schools
- Free to use for all state-funded schools (*maintained and academies*)
- Secretary of State advised schools to stop using agencies

3. Teachers' Pensions

- Announcement 10th April
- DfE will *fully-fund* increases in Teachers' Pensions for 2019-20
- Any future funding will be dependent on the outcome of the next government Spending Review (due later this year)

4. Relationship & Sex

Department for Education

Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and Health Education

Draft statutory guidance for governing bodies, proprietors, head teachers, principals, senior leadership teams, teachers

February 2019

- Published 25th Feb 2019
- Response to consultation (July –Nov. 2018)
- Regulations now approved by House of Commons and Lords
- Regulations into force in Sept. 2020 (schools can commence Sept. 2019).

GOVERNORS FOR SCHOOLS

Relationship & Sex Education

- Parental right to *request* withdrawal from some of the sex education
- Emphasis on distinction between online and real world
- Schools may teach about faith perspectives
- Teaching should reflect the law (e.g. Equality Act 2010) as applies to relationships.
- Teaching about families requires sensitive and well-judged teaching based on knowledge of pupils and their circumstances.
