Responding to the challenges of virtual governance and remote trustee monitoring

- Virtual meetings via Teams maintained same structure of Trust Board and committees with additional meetings to review the Covid-19 Risk Assessment
- Safeguarding and Health and Safety focus
- Pupil and Staff wellbeing, and working with parents, remained as key standing agenda items
- Continued School Improvement Plan via remote monitoring
- Correspondence with staff team and pupils whilst trustees not present on site
- Increased review of documentation outside of planned trustee meetings



Benefits and challenges of remote governance

• Range of views across trustees

Benefits:

- Focussed discussion
- Further strengthened relationships with staff team attending board meetings
- Reduced travel time

Challenges:

- Trustee presence at school reduced time with pupils and staff, and monitoring on site
- More difficult to focus on longer term strategy
- Discussion in meetings more limited
- Additional time outside of meetings to read all guidance/docu

Why do schools need a digital strategy?

 Technology lets real human beings doing real things in classrooms and homes around the country do those things faster, more often, more successfully, with greater insight and to greater depth.









How do Governing Bodies help?

- Not being afraid to ask difficult questions or challenge when something does not look right
- Supporting your school/college or academy in developing its strategy and in making the difficult decisions, especially around budgets





When in school/college

- How does the school/college make effective use of technology in the classroom
- When you visit, look beyond the "they are engaged" to ask how technology is helping the teacher teach and the children learn
- Is the technology reliable?
- Is equipment well used?





When in school/college

- Are staff making enough use of the tools at their disposal?
- Safe and secure access from home more cloud than knocking holes in secure systems
- Do staff have access to devices they can take home?
- Are there cupboards full of digital white elephants?
- Is your school/college paying for tools they rarely use?
