1. Covid measures



Guidance

Schools COVID-19 operational guidance

Updated 27 August 2021

.... moving away from stringent restrictions on everyone's day-to-day lives, towards advising people on how to protect themselves and others, alongside targeted interventions to reduce risk.

The situation in September 2021

Our priority is for you to deliver face-to-face, high-quality education to all pupils.

- Four key elements:
- isolation and, track and trace;
- close contact guidance;
- school contingency planning;
- changes in quarantine rules for overseas boarding pupils.



Isolation and track & trace DFE guidance:

- Contact tracing (in schools) ended
 18th July;
- NHS Test and Trace will work with pupils/parents to identify close contacts;
- Self-isolation is not necessary for family member/close contact of infected persons if:
 - fully vaccinated
 - aged under 18.6 years
 - participating in vaccine trial



Close Contact DFE guidance:

- Staff & pupils who have had close contact are expected to attend school;
- No need for masks in school but recommended and expected on public and dedicated transport;
- If local outbreak, schools are expected to work with health protection teams

Covid 'Contingency Plans'



Contingency framework: education and childcare settings

August 2021

- Sometimes called 'outbreak management plans'
- DfE say schools 'should' have them in place;
- Guidance updated August 2021.

FOR SCHOOLS

Questions for governors to ask:

- Have risk assessment and Covid procedures been reviewed?
- Have parents/carers been notified?
- Is an outbreak management plan in place?
- Is Remote Learning ready to be enacted?

Pupil Progress – a reminder

- Governors must know the outcomes of Teacher Assessment;
- Work planners and agendas should reflect regular updates to governance;
- Governors need to know what gaps exist and what is being done to close them;
- Governors should know how categories up and recovery premiums are selfect

New Recovery Premium (6th Sept.)



- Now explicitly linked to Pupil Premium;
- Available for all stated funded schools ages 4-15
- £145 mainstream pupils,
 £290 Special unit;
- Minimum 'floor' payment for all eligible schools - £2000 primary and £6000 secondary





Statutory guidance for schools and colleges

Update - January 2021 (Post EU Exit)



The Headlines



- Role of staff now includes 'promote children's welfare' (hint to Mental Health, sexual abuse and RSHE);
- online safety must be included in induction of all staff;
- new Annexe A condensed version, available for school staff not working directly with children;
- Annexe B (was A last version)

Questions for Governors to ask:

- Have staff received training on the new version of KCSIE?
- Has induction for new staff been updated?
- When was the last time governors updated their safeguarding knowledge?



3. Ofsted - Autumn 2021:



- updates on timing of inspection;
- mew guidance documents published/updated;
- impact of Covid on inspection.



Timing of inspections:

- those schools last inspected before the pandemic can expect a delay of up to six terms later than they would have;
- new schools (inc. Academies) first inspection – expect 3 years after opening;
- outstanding schools no longer exempt.



New and updated guidance:

Inspecting schools: guide for Inspecting schools: guide for maintained and academy schools maintained and academy schools should expect.

Covid - impact on inspections:

Same framework (2019) nuanced with:

- recovery from Covid-generated 'gaps';
- peer-on-peer sexual abuse and violence;
- Relationship, Sex and Health **Education**;



and don't forget:

Questions for governors to ask:

- When are we expecting Ofsted?
- Are we compliant on RSHE etc?
- Do we have a narrative on peer-onpeer sexual abuse and violence?
- Can governors clearly articulate the Covid story and the school's or trust's response?
- When did the board last review the status of the school's curriculum offer?

School Admissions Code:



School Admissions Code

Mandatory requirements and statutory guidance for admission authorities, governing bodies, local authorities, schools adjudicators and admission appeals panels

September 2021

- Replaces 2014 code;
- Effective 1st September;
- Key change re; in year admissions of vulnerable pupils.
- Includes summer 2021 revised guidance on in year fair access.

Questions for governors to ask:

- Is the school aware of the new code?
- Are we our own admissions authority?
- If so does our admissions policy need reviewing?



Early Years Framework:



Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage

Setting the standards for learning, development and care for children from birth to five

Published: 31 March 2021

Effective: 1 September 2021

- statutory;
- Aims to improve learning outcomes at age 5;
- Emphasis on early language and literacy
