New Government – The Kings Speech

Education and Skills, Schools and School Food

- Pledge to have free breakfast clubs in every primary school.
- Convert 3,334 classrooms to nursery settings, adding 100,000 childcare places, in schools where there is spare capacity due to falling birth rates. The estimated £140 million cost will be paid for by part of the money raised by putting VAT on private school fees.
- Bring Multi-Academy Trusts into the inspection system and introduce a new annual review of safeguarding, attendance, and off-rolling.

Questions for governors/trustees to ask:

- Do school leaders know the implications of the King's Speech? Have they been discussed?
- Do we have space/capacity to establish a nursery setting?
- In academies, are we aware that National Curriculum compliance is coming?





School Teachers' Pay Award – key facts:

- government commitment to fully fund teacher and support staff pay awards 2024-25;
- DfE have accepted School Teachers' Review Body Report (STRB);
- academies retain freedom to set their own pay;
- School Teachers' Pay & Conditions Document has yet to be published.



School Teachers' Pay – key guidance:








Teachers' Pay – the headlines:


- 5.5% increase at all levels (inc. allowances);
- The primary objective of our recommendations is to continue to address, in a balanced way, the structural deterioration in the pay of teachers relative to comparable professions and to improve levels of recruitment and retention.
- the requirement for Performance Related Pay is no longer compulsory from September 12 Technology


Actions/questions for governors/trustees

- What did the school/trust budget for teachers pay?
- What assumptions did the budget include regarding funding?
- Do we now have unallocated funds to spend?
- Have we made provision for support staff pay increases in the current budget?



New Attendance Regulations:









What has changed?

- all state-funded schools must submit daily attendance data to DfE;
- schools will have access to Attendance Dashboard;
- increased fines/penalties and new framework for their issue;
- new attendance codes;
- 'Attendance Contracts' replace 'Parenting Contracts'

Updated Guidance:



Working together to improve school attendance

Statutory guidance for maintained schools, academies, independent schools and local authorities

August 2024

- applies to all state-funded schools;
- reflects new regulations;
- updated expectations on schools:
 - Pupils with physical/mental illhealth
 - data sharing;
 - senior attendance champions;
 - Informing youth offending team of unexplained absences.



Questions for governors/trustees to

- Has our attendance policy need updating?
- Has information been shared with parents/carers?
- Will governors/trustees have dashboard data shared with them?
- Do we know enough about what our school/trust is doing to improve attendance?



Keeping Children Safe in Education 2024



Keeping children safe in education 2024

Statutory guidance for schools and colleges

2 September 2024

- Definitions updated to reflect 'Working Together to Safeguard Children 2023'
- 'Unexplained absence' replaces 'deliberately missing education'
- Clarity on schools remaining responsible for pupils in Alternative Provision (AP)



Don't forget:

- governors/trustees are expected to update their training regularly (i.e. annually);
- your board should have undertaken training this year;
- new governors/trustees should engage in safeguarding training as part of their induction.

Questions for governors/trustees to ask:

- Has our safeguarding policy been updated?
- Have all governors accessed training?
- Do we ensure routinely have Safer Recruitment as an agenda item?
- Does the board seek assurance that filtering and monitoring systems are in place, active and effective?


Ofsted update:



Ofsted update:

- applies to ungraded inspections (S8) only;
- end of 'Deep Dives' in ungraded inspections;
- new emphasis on 'providing school leaders with opportunities to demonstrate where they have improved and to discuss where they still have work to do';
- focus on e.g. 'group of subjects together', assessment etc;
- 'some conversations may be challenging',

Questions for governors and trustees to ask:

- Are we due an inspection (Section 8/ungraded)?
- Are leaders aware of these changes?
- Are staff prepared?
- Do we have a shared self-evaluative view of the school (i.e. Governors and SLT)?



Academy Trust Handbook – key changes:



Academy trust handbook 2024

also known as the Academies financial handbook

For academy members, trustees, accounting officers, chief financial officers and auditors

Effective from 1 September 2024

July 2024

- reminder on digital technology standards;
- reserves policy must include reserves management plan;
- Cyber-security standards reminder.



Questions for trustees to ask:

- Is the trust board assured of compliance with all aspects of the ATH 2024?
- Have we accessed cyber-security training?
 If you haven't and use RPA, you are in violation of your agreement which could impact on making a claim.

The Healing Classrooms and Healing Spaces Approach

Healing Classrooms is the IRC's global strategy to supporting children's recovery through creating safe and stable environments in schools.

Originated in 1997 and was field-tested for 6 years in conflict-affected areas in refugee camps.

Adapted for use in mainstream schools in resettlement countries from 2016 onwards to respond to the influx of refugees arriving in Europe and the US.

Adapted for UK use in 2022 along with the Healing Spaces programme to support those in the UK supporting refugee and asylum-seeking children and youth.

Healing Spaces






